Restorative Practice is a whole school approach and all staff have embraced this concept and will continue to make it part of their practice. One of the most important aspects of Restorative Practice is the language we use that positively affects everyone around us. At staff meeting this week teachers had to reflect on their own restorative practice and next week the staff will be learning about restorative chats and emotional literacy.
