Welcome back to week 2. Last week Kapahaka started for our tamariki. Matua Rehua reported back that our students have started brilliantly and they are all enjoying kapahaka. What I love about kapahaka is that it grows leaders and helps our tamariki to shine while doing something they love. Ka mau te wehi tamariki ma!

Property We have a number of exciting property projects coming up under our 10 Year Property Plan (10YPP). The projects include our new school hall, new toilets which will include High Dependency Units, a new classroom, a new admin block, new parking, driveway repairs, new heat pumps, new walkways and refurbishments in A Block (Top 5 classrooms) and refurbishments in B Block (the 2 Junior classrooms). Over the next six months we will be going through the design and planning stage for all of the above property works. We are expecting to start building early next year. To assist the Board with this huge task we have formed a Property Committee which consist of Board Members, Staff and Parents.

In September of this year all classrooms and current administration areas will have LED lights installed to reduce power consumption.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE – Throughout the alert levels there has been a lot of interest in school attendance. This is because we know going to school every day plays an important role in a student's well being.

All students should now be regularly attending kura. We are working with the Ministry of Education and other partners to understand some of the variety of reasons why students do not attend school regularly. We will work together with others to look at how we can address the factors contributing to non-attendance.

Everyone has a role to play to ensure students attend school every day.
