Attendance

By law, parents are required to ensure their child attends school every day. Your child needs to be at school before the 8.50 am bell, preferably a little earlier so that they have time to settle in and be ready for the day. If your child arrives late you need to notify the office at that time. If your child is absent, please ring the office in the morning, or write a note when the child returns explaining the absence. Unexplained absences are taken seriously and if they become regular or prolonged they will be referred to the truancy agency.

Transport

The majority of children at Whangamarino travel to school by bus. There are three bus routes: Okere Falls / Otaramarae, Mourea and the town run. The town bus costs \$80 per term per whanau. This is such a minimal cost for the distance travelled. Once your child is assigned to a bus run they will travel on that bus daily. Any changes to your child's normal routine need to be given by phone, in person or in writing to the office. Messages regarding changes to the bus run for your child must be given to office **NO LATER** than 12.00 p.m. We do not accept children telling us when and where they are to get off the buses. This is extremely important for the safety of your children and we take this responsibility seriously. We are responsible for your child until he / she reaches home. Please make sure your young child is adequately



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supervised or accompanied en-route to the pick-up point in the morning and on the return journey in the afternoon. Junior children are not old enough to cross roads or wait on the side of the road alone. We are a Road Sense school and have an ongoing road safety awareness programme throughout the school. We ask that you encourage and support this initiative with your child at home.

School app

To access up to date information be sure to download our school app available on your app store. The app is called *skool loop* and you will need to select *Whangamarino school*. Once downloaded, you can use this app to check for bus times, log in an absentee or even check our school notices.

Lunches

We do not sell school lunches anymore but there will be occasions when classes will do lunches as a fundraiser. These will be notified to parents as they happen. We can however provide food for children through KidsCan if it's needed. Please Items from home which need heating can be done in their classrooms. We also have a Pataka where children are able to heat their lunches bought from home. If your child is bringing noodles they must be pre-made in a *named microwave proof* container or in ready-made noodle cups, so staff just need to add hot water.

Stationery

The school can provide all stationery required for your child. They come all pre packed for your convenience at a very competitive price. It is important to get the stationery as soon as possible so that your child can take full part in classroom programmes. See the office to organise payment options. There is also a voluntary donation of \$10.00 per whanau. This donation is appreciated. You will find the stationery lists on our school Facebook page or website. Throughout the year, your child may purchase stationery from 8.30 am, before school starts any day of the week. It is a great help if you send correct change for school requests and clearly label what the money is for.



School Uniform

The school uniform is compulsory and can only be purchased from the school.

- School drifit polo shirt \$35.00
- School drifit tee shirt \$35.00
- School polar fleece \$45.00
- School Hat \$15.00

Black sandals are required for summer footwear. Black covered shoes with black ankle socks are required for cooler weather. These can be purchased anywhere in town. Children can also wear any tidy black bottoms such as skorts to wear with their school shirts

Payment of School Accounts

We understand that sometimes parents are unable to pay the full amount to cover uniform, bus fees, tech art and stationery at the start of the year. Part payments can be made in consultation with the Office. We prefer that parents pay directly into our school account, please just remember to indicate the name of your child/ren so we can identify the payment. Account details are:

Health

Whangamarino is well supported by health agencies whenever necessary. The public health nurse visits our school each term and is available to discuss any problems or health issues pertaining to your child/ren.

Hearing advisers, speech therapists, psychologists, SWIS and other health supporters will make themselves available when the school or parents have identified that their child requires extra health assistance.



Sickness

Please keep your child at home if he or she is sick or has wounds, infections or contagious illnesses. We have one sick bay and keeping your child home helps them recover sooner and minimises the risk of other children catching the same condition. Any medications required after returning to school should be taken at home. Where there are exceptional circumstances then please contact the office.

Mobile Dental Clinic

Once a year, the mobile dental clinic is parked at Whangamarino for almost four weeks. In this time your child will need a signed permission slip to receive free dental care in the caravan. We will let you know when it is in the school.



Mobile Ear Clinic

Whangamarino also gets regular visits from the ear clinic van. The technicians see children whose parents/teachers have concerns for and these children are checked and if necessary followed up with further checking. We will let you know when it is in the school.

Religious Instruction

Bible happens through Cool Bananaz every Thursday starting in March. Please contact the office if you do not wish your child/ren to participate at this time.

Newsletters

A school newsletter is published each week on Tuesday and sent home with the eldest or the only child in each family. Please check your child's bag for the newsletter as it will keep you informed about the things happening in our school. The school newsletter can be viewed on our school website and school facebook page too.

Lost Property

Clothing found lying around the school will be sent to the administration area lost property bin. All clothing should be named because often children do not recognise their own clothes or feel too shy to collect their clothes. Lost property is regularly displayed and you are welcome to come and search the pile. Any un-named clothing not claimed after a reasonable



time will be donated to a new owner. Unclaimed non uniform items will go to the trash at the end of each term.

Duffy Books in Homes

Whangamarino School is very fortunate to be part of the Duffy Books in Homes programme. This means that three times a year your child will get to choose their own books. These books are presented to them at special assemblies by visiting role models. This programme was established 17 years ago to encourage reading and books in the home. Help your child to value and look after these books by having a special place for them and reading them together.



Rumaki

Mā tōna reo te tangata e mōhio ana ki tōna ao.

Through one's language, one can acknowledge one's world.

Whangamarino offers total immersion from Year 0 to Year 8. Children are taught a full curriculum, utilise mainstream resources and participate in school activities. The Rumaki is further supported by advisers who work with the kaiako and students. Students must have had some prior learning in Te Reo to be enrolled in the Rumaki Unit and we expect 100% support at home to reinforce Te Reo with

your child.

Trips out of School

We have a saying in our school – ***“No slip, no trip”!*** We always seek your permission to take your child on a trip. This is usually in the form of a pānui with the trip details and a return slip at the bottom. It is essential we have your written permission, but should you misplace the pānui, then a handwritten note will be accepted. We see this as part of the child's learning to take responsibility for them and expect them to deliver all pānui home. With your New Entrant please make a habit of checking their schoolbag daily for pānui and school newsletters which are sent out every week. For all trips out of school children are expected to wear clean and tidy full school uniform, and we often leave them at school (with another teacher) if this is not the case.

We always need whanau helpers to come along on trips. It is a requirement that we have the correct ratios of adults to children when leaving the school. Every parent or caregiver must be police vetted before attending any school trips. Forms are at the school office to fill in. This



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can be a great opportunity for you to become involved in your child's school experience first hand. Other whanau members are welcome, provided they are over the age of 18 years. We rarely use whanau vehicles, but in the event that we need to use private vehicles, the driver must have a full current licence and the vehicle must be warranted and registered. All passengers must be seat-belted.

Swimming

Swimming is an essential part of our school programme during the summer, especially as we have so many rivers and lakes in our area. We have our own pool at the school and this is used in term 1 and late term 4 depending on the weather. All children are expected to participate in the swimming programme to gain confidence in the water. We ask that children wear appropriate swimming attire. Togs for girls, and shorts for boys. Please name their swimming attire, towel and provide a plastic bag for wet gear. If your child is not able to swim, a note is required please.



Assessment and Reporting to Parents

At Whangamarino we report to parents in several ways.

- Meet the Teacher Evening in Term 1 every year
- Parent Interviews – Formal

In Term 1 and Term 3 there is an opportunity to come to school for an interview with the classroom teacher about your child's progress and we urge you to attend these interviews.

- Mid and End of Year Reports will be sent home with each child.

Auraki (Mainstream) & Rumaki (Immersion Maori) have Whanau hui at least once per term throughout the year.

Mahi Kainga

We expect all children to do homework each night from Monday to Thursday. This includes your five-year-old. Make homework time age appropriate. Five year olds can manage 10 minutes while older children can work for up to half an hour. Homework will usually consist of reading and a small activity in their homework exercise book. This might be reading a poem or completing a simple practice worksheet. Please establish a routine for doing homework and returning book bags and books to school each day. These books are used in the daily class



programme so it is important that they come back to school each day and they are looked after and valued when at home. Please supervise your children during homework time.

Panui Pukapuka –Reading

Read with your child at home every day. This gives them another opportunity to practise books they have already been introduced to at school. We call this ‘reading for mileage’, the more they read the better they will become. Home reading should be easy for them and therefore enjoyable. Children enjoy reading the same books many times, even if you may have had enough!

Please take the time to read with and to your child, so that your child will get maximum benefits from the time they spend reading with you at home

Crisis Management

In the event of serious emergency or a crisis *REST ASSURED, we will take good care of your children.* The school is a Civil Defence Post and each and every teacher is responsible for their class and the Principal is responsible everyone. Our main communications will be through the school phone (07)362 4879, the cell phone (021) 2381737 and the local radio station. If we need to evacuate the school, we will move the children across the top field, down the Morehu drive way and then out across to Taheke via the road. If this route proves inaccessible, then the route will be up over the hill to Paruaharanui. We will hold all children until YOU (parent/caregiver) or the person you have delegated as the emergency contact when you enrolled collects them.

NO ONE ELSE WILL BE ALLOWED TO TAKE YOUR CHILD.

Evacuation Drills

It is a legal requirement that we practice emergency drills once per term. These will also include our staff and tamariki from Kohanga Reo ki Ohau.

Children ready to learn will:



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- *Have had plenty of sleep. (Set a bed time and be strong for the child)*
- *Have had some breakfast.*
- *Have brought a nutritious and filling lunch. (Fruit and sandwiches are good)*
- *Come to school happy because you are settled.*
- *Know that you accept them as they are.*
- *Know that you want them to listen to their teacher.*
- *Know that you love them. Send them off with a hug, a smile, a gentle word.*

Then we can do wonders with them...



**WHANGAMARINO
SCHOOL**
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Guidance for parents in assisting their children during the first years at school.

1. Be interested in work children bring home.
2. Always share daily activities with your children; this includes sharing T.V. programmes, baking, gardening, ball games, walking the dog.
3. Give your child time to explain about pictures or work they bring home and have a very special place for them for a few days.
4. Warn your child about loitering on the way home or going to play without asking you first. Warn them about “stranger danger”.
5. Fill in the health card and see he/she has received booster injections at the correct time.
6. Select the safest way to the bus pick up point and show the child where and how to cross roads. Give practice with safety rules before he/she does this on his/her own. Make sure they know where to go after school.
7. Please do not discuss teachers in front of children, or use teachers as a threat.
8. Read and tell stories and ask child questions about the story and discuss it. Explain objects and pictures and background details in the book.
9. Supply picture books to look at and be interested in and have a few simple rules for reading e.g. not eating greasy food when handling books, turning pages carefully, no tearing of pages or scribbling on them.
10. Teach the child to recognise their home address and phone number if possible, and how to write and read his/her name (not in capitals).
11. Teach them how to use a handkerchief or tissues and to cover up a sneeze or cough.
12. Be unemotional when leaving your child at school - do not creep away whilst the child is not looking. Say you will be back soon. Be firm.
13. Listen to speech and correct if necessary.
14. Teach colours, red, green, blue, white, black, yellow, brown, orange.
15. Teach the child to put away things and to take off and put on outer clothing, shoes, etc.
16. Teach them how to use and flush the toilet and when and why to wash hands - (soap and water).
17. Teach them how to peel an orange, etc.
18. Mark all clothes and shoes and sew tape hangers on cardigans, jerseys and coats. Teach the child to recognise their own clothing.
19. Give practice in performing duties and following instructions. Giving jobs e.g. setting table, bring in paper or milk.
20. Teach manners and insist on them.
21. Teach how to dress and undress e.g. zips, buttons, coats, shoes and how to do shoe laces.
22. Cut small lunches - have separate play lunch of some health foods e.g. fruit, cheese, dates, nuts, raisins, carrot etc preferably not biscuits or potato chips. We encourage litter less lunch boxes e.g. no glad wrap and no plastic wrappers.
23. Discuss when and how to use a toothbrush.
24. Encourage alphabet knowledge and counting one to ten.
25. Has your child had experience with crayons, drawing, colouring in, tracing, using paints, cutting with scissors and pasting, listening to stories, nursery rhymes, etc?
26. Get them to prepare their school bag for school. Encourage independence.
27. Prepare your child for success everyday and watch them flourish.
